

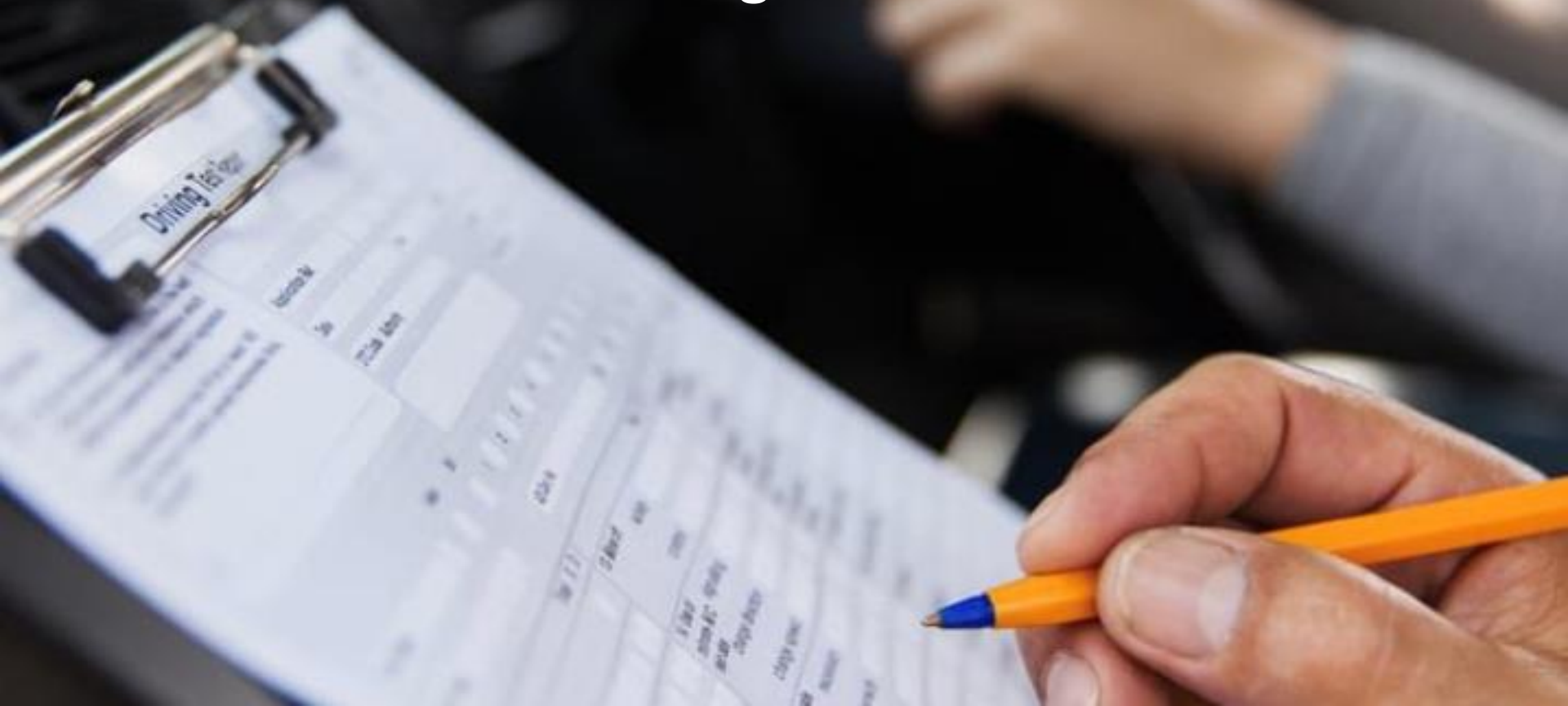
Driving rules in Britain




In Britain you are allowed to drive a car when you're seven-teen.



The person with you is not allowed to take money for the lesson unless he's got a teacher's licence.
